#### Pond

A huge thank you to South East Water and FoBS for bringing our pond back to life. The children have already had lots of opportunity to use the pond and explore the wildlife within it. We would be grateful for any parent volunteers who might be able to spare some time to keep the pond maintained so all the hard work does not go to waste. If you have any spare time please let the office know. We would also love to be able to offer a supervised lunch time club to the children, so that they can help with pond maintenance, however we would be equally grateful for any time in the holidays or the odd weekend.

Below is the press release from South East Water.

Balcombe Church of England Primary School children are enjoying a new weather station and upgraded wildlife pond thanks to a £2,000 grant from the 2024 South East Water Community Chest Fund.

The weather station is being used to support the school's science and geography curriculum, with pupils using technology to compare and contrast our weather patterns with other locations in the world. Meanwhile, the pond has been in constant use since its revamp, with pupils excitedly dipping and discovering a range of pond life.

Wendy Millbanks, Headteacher at Balcombe Church of England Primary School said: "The joy on the pupil's faces when looking closely at a newt, or identifying a water boatman is a delight to see. The children love being outside in the sun, close to nature and learning more about the mysteries of the underwater world. Without the grant given to us, we would not have been able to repair the platforms and make our pond safe, so it would have remained out of bounds for another year, with so many learning opportunities lost. We look forward to using both the weather station and our pond to support learning for many years to come."

The Eco Pioneers Project, which Spring Class worked on earlier in the year, provided a £150 grant for us to use on an idea generated as part of the children's work. Many of their ideas have already been put in place thanks to another sustainability grant. We have therefore used the Eco Pioneers Project money to buy two bicycle racks to encourage our children to ride their bikes to school. Florence, Matilda, Aengus and Emma were keen that we encourage less air pollution from cars around school, so this seemed a

## **Pupil Premium**

If you are on a low income making a FSM application can greatly benefit your child.

It is often thought that parents of children in KS1 who currently receive Universal Free School Meals do not need to make a Free School Meals Application for the school to receive Pupil Premium. THIS IS NOT THE CASE.


Please contact the office if you think you may be eligible for Pupil Premium funding. Any accepted applications for Free School Meals (whether or not your child takes the meal up) attract over £1300 per child per year which the school can use to greatly enhance the resources available for your child both within the classroom and for extra-curricular activities. We may be able to help with school uniform costs, trips and other extra-curricular activities like swimming and music tuition.
