Easter Service

Our school's Easter Service will be held in St. Mary's church on Monday 1^e April at 1.45 p.m. Families and friends of Balcombe School children are very welcome to join our Easter celebrations.



As part of our School Improvement Plan this year we have been focussing on improving our children's vocabulary. This is done in a number of ways: playing games; explicitly teaching new words; spelling activities, reading activities and by promoting a wider range of reading material. We encourage all of our children to read every day at home and the expectation is that you will support us in this, knowing that the skill of reading is key. One of our parents shared these facts with me recently and I thought I would share them with you:

1 minute per day, they will read for a total of 6 hrs and 5 mins per year and 42 hrs by the end of yr 6

5 mins per day, they will read for a total of 30 hrs and 25 mins per year and 212 hrs by the end of y 6

If your child reads for...

20 minutes per day, they will read for a total of 121 hours and 40 mins per year and 851 hours by the end of year 6.



This child will hear/read 8,000 words per year and is likely to achieve better in standardised tests than 10% of their peers.



This child will hear/read 282,000 words per year and is likely to score higher than 50% of their peers. 1,800,000 words



However the child that reads for 20 minutes per day will hear/read 1,800,000 words per year and is likely to score higher than 90% of their peers.

Fire Drill

Last week, we did a fire drill with the children and I'm pleased to say that we managed to get everyone evacuated from the building and accounted for in our fastest ever time of 1 min 36 secs. All of the children were amazingly quiet, calm and sensible. Well done Balcombe pupils!

Book Exchange

Does your child have a pile of books at home that they have already read? Do you wish you had the opportunity to exchange them for other titles for free? <u>How it works</u>

On Monday and Thursday mornings at 8.40 am, a book exchange suitcase will appear on the playground: there will be one full of "quick reads" and another with more challenging texts. The idea is that your child brings a book from home they no longer want and places it in the suitcase. This allows them to choose another book from the suitcase to take away and read. They can keep the book if they like or return it when they have finished with it - it's their choice. <u>Book criteria</u>

• Children must select the same type of book they donated - this ensures everyone is exchanging fairly. For example, if your child brings a picture book, they must take a picture book away.

- Books must be in new or gently worn condition.
- We are particularly looking for new authors or lesser known books.

Please note: colouring books, sticker books and activity/puzzle books will not be accepted. The first book exchange morning will be on Monday 1[#] April (not an April Fool!). Please start searching for those books that your children no longer read or want and get them ready to swap. Of course they may bring in more than one book if they wish.

Over the last few years, the number of PTA members has sadly diminished. Vikki Cripps and Lucy Chettleburgh have co-chaired the committee for two years with a very small number of members. Despite this, the PTA has managed to raise an enormous amount of money for the school. Due to the current lack of appropriate funding from the government, the PTA funds are no longer used solely for nice-tohave extras for the children, but are often needed to support the provision of key curriculum resources. We have recently purchased new laptops for the children to use and the full £7000 came from the PTA. This purchase simply would not have been possible without their fundraising. Much of the money they raise isn't spent on major projects, but on equally important small things to enable us to continue to provide the high quality of teaching and learning that we are so proud of. Without the PTA, we would not have the POD resourced for learning, the shade sails to provide sun safety, or even the paint to produce the backdrop for our productions – the PTA is not an additional luxury, it's a fundamental part of the school.

From the end of the summer term, neither Vikki nor Lucy are able to continue in their PTA roles (and as you know we are already without a treasurer) and it is unlikely that many of the remaining members will stay on as their children will no longer be at the school. This leaves us with the very definite possibility of not having a PTA at all.

REMINDER

Pupil Premium

If you are on a low income making a FSM application can greatly benefit your child.

It is often thought that parents of children in KS1 who currently receive Universal Free School Meals do not need to make a Free School Meals Application for the school to receive Pupil Premium. THIS IS NOT THE CASE.

Please read the linked information letter which explains that any accepted applications for Free School Meals (whether or not your child takes the meal up) attract £1320 per child per year which the school can use to greatly enhance the resources available for your child both within the classroom and for extra-curricular activities. We may be able to help with school uniform costs, trips and other extracurricular activities like swimming and music tuition.

Making an application is easy and confidential. LINK to pupil premium letter
