Dear Parents,

Last July, we officially became part of Hurst Education Trust. Being part of an academy has brought a few changes for us, some very noticeable to pupils and staff, some not so. The main change that we hope our pupils will notice and benefit from as time goes on, will be greater access to resources and opportunities. We are already using a new format for teaching writing, called "I am a clever writer" which was funded by HET. This breaks down the teaching of the mechanics of writing into very small steps, allowing children to master the basics before branching out into higher order writing skills. We will still aim to develop writers with a passion for writing and a strong writer's voice, but through using this new format, will ensure that they use punctuation and grammar correctly too. That, coupled with continuing the good work started last year through our focus on spelling, should lead to improvement in our pupils' writing attainment. So far, early indications are good. The children seem to like the new approach and work in their books shows good progress already.

We hope that you are able to come in and see for yourself, by joining us for our "book look" on Thursday 5th December at 2:15pm. For parents with younger children, don't forget to let us know if you won't be joining us and are worried that your child might get upset, then we can ensure your child is engaged somewhere else during the session.

Since joining HET, a noticeable change for staff, is the fairly regular appearance of HET staff and trustees in school. We have had many visitors since September, some for familiarisation with the school and others in order to support and challenge our senior leadership team. Our visitors always spend some time in classrooms and engage with the children and staff.

Handwriting

We are very impressed with how neatly the majority of our pupils write, using a neat, cursive style. We are even more impressed by the pupils who have found developing a neat handwriting style really tricky, but who have worked hard to develop this. As a result, after Christmas, we would like to invite ALL of our pupils from year 4 up, to use a pen in school for writing. Children may use a fountain pen (Parker Vector ones are recommended as they are relatively sturdy and good for left handers too) or a rollerball type pen such as Berol handwriting pen. Biros are not appropriate. With this in mind, you may want to consider a Christmas gift to add to your child's pencil case. Please ensure that you purchase pens with blue ink. As a reminder, see the list below for other items that your child will need in their pencil case.

Census Day – 16 January 2025

Census Day is an important day in the School calendar, as the Government will use the numbers of those who eat school meals on this day to identify the level of funding each school receives for Universal Free School meals. For the Census Day we will pre book hot dinners for all children in Reception, Year1 and Year 2. Please do check on ParentPay and change the meal choice if required by **Thursday 2 January 2025**. If your child has any food allergies and you haven't already advised Chartwells, you will need to complete a medical diet request which can be found on their website.

Meals are free for Reception, Year1 & 2 and children are encouraged to try a hot meal even if it is just a taste. If you feel your child will not eat the lunch provided please feel free to send in a packed lunch as well.

Nativity Tickets

I have been asked by a parent to explain the rationale behind the introduction of charging for Nativity tickets this year, which of course, I am very happy to do.

The challenges and expectations facing schools have changed rapidly over the past few years, not least due to the impact of the pandemic and the cost of living crisis. However, funding and resourcing has failed to keep up, leaving schools struggling to meet the increased needs of pupils. We work creatively to ensure that our provision is not affected by the severe lack of funding, but rely even more heavily on the goodwill of parents and our community in general to be able to provide all of the "extra" resources and opportunities that our children love.

Over the last few years, we have seen a dramatic reduction in the capacity of our parent body to assist in the organisation and running of FOBS fundraising events such as our Christmas and Summer Fair, resulting in some of these crucial fundraising opportunities becoming impossible to continue. Unfortunately, not being in an area considered deprived, or having a large number of children eligible for Pupil Premium funding, our budget allocation gets more difficult to manage each year and I am therefore very grateful to parents who have purchased items from the class wish lists to help with this, in addition to staff who regularly purchase resources for their classes.

Determined not to allow our pupils to suffer from the budgetary constraints that we face, we continue to plan enrichment activities in the hope that our community will find ways to fund them. In the last week of this term, we are planning an expressive arts week for the children, with a visitor in each day to lead workshops in pop dance, Bollywood, drama and singing. FOBS have generously agreed to help with the funding for this, so that we don't need to charge parents, but using the Nativity ticket money is one way of stretching the FOBS money to go just that little bit further.

By charging this small amount, we are merely bringing the infant Nativity in line with the junior production, for which we have made a ticket charge for many years. Aside from being an excellent fundraising opportunity, the money is used to buy the script, music, licence and cover the cost of any props or scenery that we need.

Obviously for any parent unable or unwilling to pay this, I will review the price, as I don't want this to be a barrier to any parent experiencing the joy of seeing their child perform in the Nativity. Please do get in touch if purchasing a ticket is causing concern.

REMINDER

Pupil Premium

If you are on a low income making a FSM application can greatly benefit your child.

It is often thought that parents of children in KS1 who currently receive Universal Free School Meals do not need to make a Free School Meals Application for the school to receive Pupil Premium. THIS IS NOT THE CASE.

Please contact the office if you think you may be eligible for Pupil Premium funding. Any accepted applications for Free School Meals (whether or not your child takes the meal up) attract over £1300 per child per year which the school can use to greatly enhance the resources available for your child both within the classroom and for extra-curricular activities. We may be able to help with school uniform costs, trips and other extra-curricular activities like swimming and music tuition.
