Dear Parents,

A belated Happy New Year to you all. It's been lovely to see all of our children back with their new Christmas present hats, gloves and scarves. Please keep sending them in as the playground can be quite a cold, windswept place to be.

As promised, I would like to share with you, the results of the parent survey carried out last term. We had a great response, 43 replies in all, the vast majority of which were very positive.

"...... Every child is treated as an individual person and their individual needs/personality is celebrated." A parent

That said, there are clearly some areas where we can improve.

Only one response indicated that a pupil was not happy and feeling safe at school, with well over half choosing to strongly agree with the first two statements. I am of course very pleased about this, but can't help wishing that the survey was not anonymous so that I could work with the family of the one child who isn't happy to turn that around. As with any of the statements, I would welcome the chance to speak with any parents who have disagreed so that I might endeavour to improve our provision for all of our pupils. Please don't hesitate to arrange to meet with me to discuss any issues that you might have. As a school, we know we are far from perfect, but I promise you, we do all want the best for the children in our care and constantly strive to provide the best educational experience possible.

"The children are all well behaved, and the collegiate nature and strong support that e.g. older children show younger children, and the values instilled by teachers and wider staff is great." A parent

Five parents disagreed that the school makes them aware of what the children are learning and four did not feel they knew how their child was doing. When reflecting on this, I realised that although we do publish lots of information about our curriculum on our website, we could perhaps be better at reminding parents about this and directing them to the relevant documents. With that in mind, please do take a look at the website - Our School -Curriculum – Maths/English/History/Art etc. Within each area amongst other things, you will find our rationale for teaching the subject and a detailed content map for each class. We work on a two year cycle and are currently on year B. This is the best way to find out what your child will be learning about this term. Teachers are also happy to have quick conversations about this at the gate each morning, for example to suggest somewhere that might make a good family outing to support the curriculum, or make appointments after school to discuss any more detailed gueries or concerns you have about your child's progress. Please don't feel that you have to wait until parents evening to find out if your child is learning well.

"It would be nice to get more regular and specific updates regarding my child's academic progress and what she has been up to in school each week." A parent

Four parents did not feel that their concerns had been dealt with properly and to those parents I would like to extend an open invitation to meet with me again if they feel that would be helpful.

"The school has such a warm ethos and my daughter is genuinely so happy to go in the doors each morning. They have just cultivated such a lovely environment for the children to learn and makes friends in." A parent

Most of the parents of pupils with SEND, feel that their children are well supported, however three (out of eleven) do not feel this. This result was a surprise to us all, as we pride ourselves on the strength of our inclusion and the amount of progress that our pupils make from their starting points. Again, I would urge those parents to come and speak to Mrs Cleverton, the class teacher or myself, so that we may address any issues.

"I feel my children receive good pastoral care and support as they need extra help with their SEND needs." A parent

Whilst most parents appreciate the range of planned activities to promote good personal development, some felt that we could do more in this area. With funding always a limiting factor, we really rely on FOBs and other income streams to enable those extra opportunities. Our Expressive Arts week was a huge success and we are planning a "Technologies" week before Easter, but in order to facilitate this and other charity events/theme days/trips/visitors etc, we need parental engagement to be consistently high. To be able to develop this further, we will need continuing help and support from FOBS and our parent body.

"I think there are areas for improvement but these would be challenging without additional finances e.g more teaching space, more opportunities to take part in sports, drama etc." A parent

Finally, I think that as time goes on, parents will see more benefit from us being part of HET. Staff have already seen benefits associated with resourcing, training, collegiate working and advisory support. Some children have attended enrichment opportunities organised by HET and these should continue to grow in the future.

REMINDER

Pupil Premium

If you are on a low income making a FSM application can greatly benefit your child.

It is often thought that parents of children in KS1 who currently receive Universal Free School Meals do not need to make a Free School Meals Application for the school to receive Pupil Premium. THIS IS NOT THE CASE.

Please contact the office if you think you may be eligible for Pupil Premium funding. Any accepted applications for Free School Meals (whether or not your child takes the meal up) attract over £1300 per child per year which the school can use to greatly enhance the resources available for your child both within the classroom and for extra-curricular activities. We may be able to help with school uniform costs, trips and other extra-curricular activities like swimming and music tuition.
