In Lake class, we enjoy spending time talking to the children, listening to their ideas and observing them. We love discovering what excites and motivates them as well as of course the skills, knowledge and understanding that they have about the world around them. This helps us to plan the best possible curriculum that matches not only their learning needs but also their interests. This ensures that children are engaged in a curriculum that is relevant and that motivates them to learn.

Every day children will have opportunities to:

- Learn, play and explore in our indoor and outdoor learning environments, setting their own goals and challenges as to what they can create – developing self-confidence and independence
- Develop friendships with a range of different children learning to share, take turns and learn from each other
- Learn with adults in small teams or on a one to one the skills, knowledge and understanding about the world around them in learning tasks matched to their needs
- Enjoy songs, stories, rhymes every day to develop an enjoyment of words and stories and of books
- Take part in daily opportunities to develop as confident communicators who are able to listen, talk and explain their ideas about their experiences
- Engage in daily phonics and reading activities learning to read, step by step, sound by sound
- Participate in daily mathematical activities
- Be active in the great outdoors!

Physical Development

Every day children will be engaged in some form of physical activity. Therefore, every day they could be climbing on the outdoor apparatus, dancing in the hall or playing games in the ball court!

PE days are every Wednesday and Friday and so children should come to school dressed in their PE kits on these days.

Reading at home together

In order to foster a love of reading, children will have an opportunity to choose a story book from our class library to share and talk about at home with their family. We refer to this book as a 'sharing book.' New 'sharing books' come home each week. Children love this!

Children will also bring home a phonic reading book to share with their families that is matched to their phonic skills so that they can share what they have been learning at school with you and rehearse their new skills.

The more children read, the more they develop their skills, knowledge and understanding. We ask that children have a reading experience at home every day, whether it is sharing a 'sharing book,' rehearsing phonic skills when reading a phonic book or looking at their words/sounds in their book bag.
