Dear Parents,

We are now eight months into our membership of the Hurst Education Trust and I thought I'd tell you a little about a few of the benefits that we are finding so far.

Some of our year 6 pupils have been attending challenge workshops for more able mathematicians, giving them the opportunity to work alongside pupils from other schools and experience being taught by maths specialists. When asked, our children still said they preferred Mr Evans as their teacher though! Last week, all of Mill class spent the day at Hurst College, taking part in an Arts day, trying activities such as street dance, drumming, boomwhackers, Zumba and drama.

We have also used HET minibuses to transport children on occasion, when parents were not able to help. We are trying to keep as much of our mileage allocation in reserve for the summer term when there are many more sporting event happening.

This half term, staff have had the opportunity to meet with teachers in other schools, to work together on developing their leadership in key curriculum areas and through networking, have brought new ideas and resources back into our school. We will soon also be working with the other schools to look at assessment of writing, moderating our judgments together to ensure consistency and accuracy.

Headteachers meet every half term to discuss a range of themes, including assessment, curriculum, policies and improvement priorities for both HET as a whole and individual schools.

We have recently had a visit from our HET School Improvement Partner who worked with the leadership team to evaluate the impact of changes introduced in the school in terms of curriculum, allocation of resources etc and also began to identify priorities for next year.

Just before Easter, we will be attending a shared INSET day focussing on the use of powerful questioning in the classroom, something that as a school we have been looking at this term.

At the moment, many of the benefits are indirectly affecting the pupils, such as provision of resources, professional development, leadership support, but we hope that as time goes on, there will also be more opportunities which will directly positively impact our pupils. Areas being investigated for future focus by HET include provision of school lunches, behaviour for learning, taking the stress out of SATs (for children not teachers) and the use of AI.

Pupil Premium

If you are on a low income making a FSM application can greatly benefit your child.

It is often thought that parents of children in KS1 who currently receive Universal Free School Meals do not need to make a Free School Meals Application for the school to receive Pupil Premium. THIS IS NOT THE CASE.

Please contact the office if you think you may be eligible for Pupil Premium funding. Any accepted applications for Free School Meals (whether or not your child takes the meal up) attract over £1300 per child per year which the school can use to greatly enhance the resources available for your child both within the classroom and for extra-curricular activities. We may be able to help with school uniform costs, trips and other extra-curricular activities like swimming and music tuition.
